Dear Members and Friends,

Yes we would like to have more people in church on Sunday mornings; however, it is our responsibility to invite our friends, our neighbors and our family members. It is our responsibility to teach others what it means to have a loving relationship with God. It is our responsibility to live out our beliefs.

My prayer is we continue to learn what it means to be a welcoming church, continuing to embrace one another in God's love, and to believe God is calling this church to great things in this community.

Synopsis of February Minutes

Board meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Brad Uelmen. Worship moment was read by Brad Uelmen. A prayer was said by Rev. Jeannie. A motion was made by Veronica Shea to approve minutes as printed; seconded by Bob Greene. Motion approved.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

- One Great Hour of Sharing envelopes for March 22 were given to Kathy Immel.
- Confirmation will be April 5.
- A new printer was purchased for the pastor after the old one stopped working.
- Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 p.m., Maundy Thursday with Communion at 7:00 p.m., Good Friday will be a joint service with 1st Congregational UCC. Time to be determined.
- We will have a pot luck lunch after service on March 1 and watch the movie Chocolat. We will then have discussions about the movie on the Wednesdays during Lent. The first discussion will be March 4 at 7:00 p.m.

FINANCIAL REPORT: We received 92% of money pledged YTD. 54% of what was needed to cover monthly expenses was received in January. A motion was made by Bob Scudder to approve the Financial Report; seconded by Kathy Immel; report approved.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT: February 28 will be the 30 Hour Famine fasting program for the youth. Many activities will be planned. Pizza will be served for the kids after church the next day. Lenten boxes were distributed. Amy Wheelock-Brodzik will be talking with Rev. Jeannie about a possible Easter program for the kids.

MUSIC & WORSHIP/BUILDING & GROUNDS: The board recommends bringing to the congregation in a special meeting to proceed to fix the entire roof in the spring of 2009 for an approximate cost of \$70,000. We recommend having multiple fundraisers to offset the costs. What isn't raised, we'll seek congregational approval to take from the endowment fund. Motion was made by Veronica Shea to approve;

seconded by Kathy Immel; motion approved. This is the second consecutive board meeting that this motion was passed. Once we have a firm bid, we will proceed with a congregational meeting.

EVANGELISM: Bob Greene would like to update the membership rolls and nametags. He will put a committee together.

OLD BUSINESS: Keith Switalski attended the meeting to discuss the needed upgrade to the security system. He received quotes from Brinks and ADT. ADT was the cheaper quote and the one that Keith recommended. Amy Wheel-Brodzik made a motion to proceed the Option 1 from ADT (\$4,337.37) with half of the money coming from the Building & Grounds fund and half coming from the Memorial fund. Veronica Shea seconded the motion; motion carried. Keith also reported that a boiler inspection needs to be scheduled. Amy Wheelock-Brodzik reported on the documentation and procedures committee. She has a few people willing to help. The policy will be on file in the church office.

NEW BUSINESS: A discussion was held about attracting new members to St. Luke's. We talked about how to promote ourselves throughout the community. We need to promote the programs we have. The website was a good step and is a good vehicle to promote our programs.

ANYTHING ELSE: Bob Greene volunteered for next month's worship moment. Next regular meeting is Tuesday, March 10, 2009 at 6:30 p.m. Brad Uelmen closed the meeting at 8:20 p.m.; meeting adjourned.
